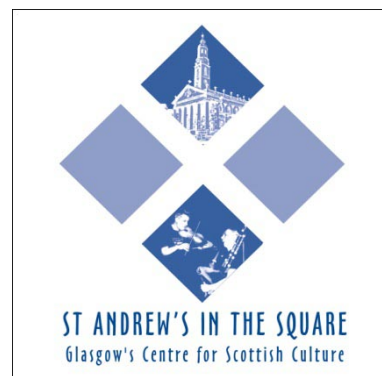

MacKinnon, MacColl, MacPherson - Borne from the thriving Glasgow and Edinburgh folk scenes, Mackinnon/MacColl/MacPherson is an explosive combination of three like-minded young musicians. Maeve Mackinnon (vocals) and Lauren MacColl (fiddle) first met whilst students at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama. Lauren MacColl is current holder of Instrumentalist of the Year (Scottish Trad Awards) and a former BBC Radio 2 Young Folk Award winner. Maeve Mackinnon was nominated for Gaelic Singer of the Year 2008 and won Up and Coming Artist of the Year 2007 (Scottish Trad Awards). Highly regarded as a multi-instrumentalist and singer-songwriter, Ewan MacPherson is probably best known for his guitar and banjo playing with the Nordic/Scottish folk band Fribo, as well as being a former member of the award-winning band Malinky. He was also one of the first students at Paul McCartney's Liverpool Institute for Performing Arts. Together they form
